Once certified, you will have the opportunity to serve your community and help your friends and neighbors when they need help the most. Come share in the pride, professionalism and friendship among the members of the *Elizabeth Fire Protection District*.

The Elizabeth Fire Protection District provides emergency fire suppression, rescue and emergency medical services to over 111 square miles of Elbert County. *EFPD* operates 24 hours per day, 7 days-a-week. Our combination paid/reserve department runs an average of 1,000 calls annually. *EFPD* personnel enjoy the highest quality of training, as well as the most advanced equipment and apparatus available. Men and women age 21 to 45 who have the desire and physical capability to participate in Fire, Rescue and Emergency Medical Service are encouraged to apply.

Participation as a "reserve" member provides a sense of accomplishment you will not find anywhere else. The self esteem and personal rewards gained by working as a team under difficult circumstances is a unique and distinctive experience. Our department is well known regionally for our superior training programs and professionalism. The prospect for advancement is very real. Over the past few years, many of our reserve members have been hired-on for career positions by *EFPD* and some of the largest fire departments in the state.

We have three fire stations in our district. Station 271 and 273 are staffed 24/7.
